The Secretariat of the Association of North East Asia Regional Governments (NEAR) wishes you tremendous success in every endeavor in 2020. In addition, I would like to express our deep appreciation for your support and cooperation for the Association's development in 2019.

I have committed myself to strive to enhance the international position and solidarity of the Association which holds 78 regional members from 6 countries since my inauguration as the fifth secretary general last May. However, the Secretariat has received feedback that there has been a decline in cohesion since the Association has doubled in size since its inception in 1996 with 29 regional members from 4 countries.

I have found that the principal cause lies in the insufficient communication caused in part by different political structures and systems and a lack of endeavor by the Secretariat to compensate for this. Therefore, I have made a concerted effort to improve this problem at a Secretariat level.

At the 12th Working Committee Meeting held by Sakha Republic (Yakutia), I suggested that NEAR regional members organizing exchange events should present the agenda and schedule at least two months prior to international events after forming sufficient consensus among members. Furthermore, I made public detailed operating expenses of the Secretariat for the first time, proving transparency as an international organization.

Following my inauguration, for six months I paid courtesy calls on 12 regional members: six in China, two in Japan, two in South Korea, and two in Russia to discuss active communication methods between NEAR members and the Secretariat. I also visited five prefectures of Japan, including Kumamoto and Miyagi Prefectures to engage new members.

In particular, the Secretariat has made every endeavor to enhance NEAR's reputation as an international organization due to its relatively low recognition despite being launched 23 years ago. The Secretariat conducted interviews with local press frequently during visits to regional governments and distributed report materials actively to the press. As a result, the Secretariat obtained excellent results with a four-fold increase in the coverage of NEAR activities in newspapers and broadcasting channels compared to in 2018. In addition, starting this year, we plan to construct human networks appointing honorary ambassadors to each regional member to promote NEAR.

This year, the 13th General Assembly will be held in Sakha Republic (Yakutia), the chair of the Association. As NEAR's biggest international exchange event is held every two years, we would like to ask for the enthusiastic participation of each member. The Secretariat will make further efforts to ensure internal stability of international exchange events including the International Forum, Working-level Workshop, and Northeast Asia Young Leaders Forum.

In the new year, I would like to ask for your active participation in returning to the founding principles of the Association to achieve the common prosperity of the regional governments of Northeast Asia based on the spirit of mutual benefit and equality.

Main Activities of the Association

Ready for a New Leap

I. The 12th NEAR Working Committee

1. Overview

The 12th Working Committee Meeting was held at the Sakha Convention Hall situated in Yakutsk City, the Sakha Republic (Yakutia). There were 79 attendees from the NEAR Secretariat and 19 Member Regional Governments from 4 countries: China (6), Japan (3), South Korea (7), and Russia (3).



2. Main Content

<Opening Ceremony>

At the opening ceremony of the 12th Working Committee held on Wednesday, August 7, there was an opening address from the prime minister of the Sakha Republic (Yakutia) in Russia, Vladimir Solodorf, and a congratulatory speech from NEAR Secretary General, Kim Ok-chae. Next, the Minister of the Department of Foreign Relations & National Business of the Sakha Republic (Yakutia), Kirillin Gavril, gave a presentation titled, 'The Investment and Tourism Potential of Sakha Republic (Yakutia).'

<Working Committee Session I>

In the first session of the Working Committee, which was held after the opening ceremony, NEAR major activities were reported.

Report on NEAR Major Activity

First, the NEAR Secretariat reported the progress results of major business in 2018 and the progress plans and current state of main activities in 2019. Subsequently, in the NEAR subcommittee Activity Report, Toyama Prefecture, Japan gave an activity report on the Subcommittee on Environment and the current situation of the implementation of individual projects in 2019. In addition, Hyogo Prefecture in Japan shared an activity report on the 17th Subcommittee on Disaster Prevention and Next Hosting Plan. Next, Krasnoyarsk Region, Russia, gave a report on the activity results of the 'NEAR Northeast Asia Young Leaders Forum 2019' which was held in BIRYUSA campsite in Krasnoyarsk Region together with co-hosts, the NEAR Secretariat and the Krasnoyarsk Region.

Presentations from Representatives of NEAR Members

Hunan Province promoted the strengths of Hunan Province and suggested the building of a cooperative e-commerce system between members as the coordinator of the Subcommittee on E-Commerce. Shandong Province in China introduced the province and asked for the active participation of members in the 6th NEAR Subcommittee on Maritime Affairs and Fisheries. Also, Gwangju Metropolitan City, South Korea gave a presentation on the theme, 'Human Rights City and Gwangju, and Global Cooperation,' and Gyeongsangbuk-do Province, South Korea introduced the plans to host the 13th NEAR Subcommittee on Economy & Trade and Gyeongju World Culture EXPO. Lastly, Amur Region had a time of publicity titled, 'Amur Region: Prospect of



cooperation between Northeast Asian nations.'

< Working Committee Session II>

The prime minister of the Republic of Sakha, Prime Minister Vladimir Solodorf, and NEAR Secretary General Kim Ok-chae presided over the meeting. At the second session of this meeting, operation improvement plans of the association activities were introduced, postponement on membership fees, and plans for the appointment of honorary ambassadors by each regional member. Also, the original agenda set by the Secretariat was passed in favor of the majority including 30 regional governments which exercised their voting rights in writing. In conclusion, an agreement was announced and the meeting was closed.

Main Agenda

The following four bills and two reports were placed and approved in the 12th Working Committee Meeting.

- 1) Bill 1 : operation improvement plans of the association activities
- 2) Bill 2 : postponement on membership fees
- 3) Bill 3 : plans for the appointment of honorary ambassadors by each regional member
- 4) Bill 4 : sharing of plans on main events of the Secretariat in 2020 and collecting feedback
- 5) Report 1 : bids for the 14th chair member
- 6) Report 2 : details of the Secretariat's budget execution in 2018

At this Working Committee, the Secretariat suggested operation improvement plans for Association events and these are set to become operation methods in future Association events. It was decided that payment would be postponed for the present time. In addition, the Secretariat decided to appoint opinion leaders suggested by regional governments as NEAR honorary ambassadors. They released the Secretariat's main events plans for 2020 and reflected member opinions. Meanwhile, the Secretariat determined to receive applications until before the General Assembly in 2020 because no regional members expressed a wish to hold the 14th General Assembly at this Working Committee Meeting. On top of that, the Secretariat reported the details on the 2018 budget execution of the Secretariat for the first time. The Secretariat has been the sole bearer of management costs since 2005 when Gyeongsangbuk-do Province, South Korea supported the permanent Secretariat.

3. Additional Events

After the meeting ended, the representatives of regional governments took part in a local tour of UNESCOregistered Lena Pillars Nature Park, prepared by the Republic of Sakha (Yakutia) the next day, on Thursday,



Agreement on the 12th NEAR Working Committee

The 12th NEAR Working Committee which was held by Sakha Republic of Russia in August 7, 2019 was attended by 19 NEAR Regional Members from 4 countries: People's Republic of China, Japan, Republic of Korea, and Russian Federation, and 49 Regional Governments including 30 NEAR Members who submitted a written resolution to exercise their vote.

At the first session of the meeting which followed the opening ceremony, there were reports on the major business activities of the NEAR Secretariat, the result of the 12th General Assembly, the outcome of the Subcommittee activities from Toyama and Hyogo Prefectures in Japan, and the result of the Northeast Asia Young Leaders Forum. Also, Hunan Province, Shandong Province, Gwangju Metropolitan City, Gyeongsangbuk-do Province, and Amur Region of Russia gave presentations regarding the major interests of regional members.

Sakha Republic suggested giving presentations at the 13th General Assembly in 2020 with regard to investment, export, and tourism on the purpose of business development and economy and trade cooperation between NEAR Regional Governments and the NEAR Secretariat decided to ask for the participation of regional members who were interested.

During the second session, four agendas were raised: the suggestion of operation improvement plan for Association events, postponement of payment of membership fees, the appointment of honorary ambassadors, sharing of plans of major Secretariat events, and a collection of members' opinions. Main content in accordance with agendas, consideration, and resolution of matters are as follows:

1. Operation Improvement Plan of Association Events

The following agreements were made to improve the problems with the quantitative expansion of the Association such as the lack of prior coordination of agenda and schedule, and the lack of presentation and discussion content due to relay interpretation. First, when Association events are held such as General Assembly, Working Committee, Subcommittee, Working-level Workshop, and the NEAR International Forum, organizing regional governments should send an official invitation letter at least 3 months in advance with regard to the event period, theme (agenda), and venue. The Secretariat should send this information as an official letter to NEAR members immediately after reviewing.

Second, regional governments hoping to participate in the event should submit an attendance list and relative information to the Secretariat up to 2 months before for the smooth event preparation and process of the organizer.

Third, regional governments wishing to give presentations should hand in presentation materials 1 month before and presentation scenarios 2 weeks before the event in a bid to aid smooth translation · interpretation because the Association events are held in 5 or 6 languages.

However, this improvement plan will be recommended without forcibleness because it is designed for the enhancement of participation rates of the Association events and for smooth events process and adequate communication.

2. Deferment of Membership Payment Time

Although "Regulations on Membership Fee_ were established and the introduction of the bill was passed at the 11th General Assembly in 2016, a considerable number of members expressed negative opinions regarding the membership payment until now. Therefore, the Secretariat decided to postpone the payment time for the present until an agreement could be formed on the purpose of use and after reliability could be secured regarding budget execution and revised relevant regulations on the membership fee.

3. Suggestion on the Appointment of Honorary Ambassador by Regional Members

The Secretariat decided to appoint NEAR honorary ambassadors in the name of Secretary General to raise awareness of the Association. All members are to submit names of qualified persons and recommend them by each country and region. Honorary ambassadors would be asked to deal with the press, deliver lectures, and participate in international exchange actively to promote NEAR activities under the close cooperation with applicable NEAR members. The Secretariat made a decision to notify the members of the details including the time to appoint honorary ambassadors, numbers, and term to regional governments through an official letter at a later date.

4. Sharing of Major Association Events Schedule and Collection of Opinions of Regional Governments in 2020

The Secretariat released main events plans for 2020 such as the NEAR International Forum, Working-level Workshop, and Northeast Asia Young Leaders Forum and stated that it would gather and reflect the NEAR members' opinions actively during the process of events preparation.

Additionally, the Secretariat determined to receive applications until before the 13th General Assembly because no regional members expressed a wish to hold the 14th General Assembly at this Working Committee Meeting. Also, the Secretariat reported the details on budget execution of the Secretariat for the first time, and NEAR members expressed their gratitude to Gyeongsangbuk-do Province, South Korea for bearing all management costs since the establishment of a permanent Secretariat.

Regional Governments took the 12th Working Committee as an opportunity to make a resolution to activate the somewhat depressed international exchange of the Association by improving management methods of the Association events, and to make efforts to raise the profile of NEAR.

Center of Cooperation and Exchange of Northeast Asia, NEAR

II. NEAR International Forum 2019

1. Overview

The NEAR International Forum on Cruise Tourism 2019 was held from February 20 to 22, 2019 at the POSCO International Center. The forum was hosted by the NEAR Secretariat and co-organized by the International Cruise Industry Research Institute and Gyeongbuk Policy Institute. The forum was attended by 300 attendees including 7 attendees from 3 Chinese regional governments, 5 attendees from 1 Japanese regional governments, 30 attendees from 6 Korean regional governments, 5 attendees from 3 Russian regional governments, 20 guest speakers, representatives from cruise companies, travel agencies, enterprises, and local participants.

Various ways for practical cooperation methods for activation of cruise tourism were discussed in the forum which was themed ^rActivation of Northeast Asian Cruise Tourism_J.

Major Content

Opening

The forum progressed with an opening greeting by NEAR Secretary General Hong Jong-kyoung, a welcoming speech by Deputy Governor of Economy Division of Gyeongsangbuk-do Province Jeon Woo-hyun, congratulatory speeches by Chairperson of Gyeongsangbuk-do Council Jang Kyung-sik, Mayor of Pohang Lee Kang-deok, Major of Gyeongju Joo Nak-young, Consul-General of the Russian Federation in Busan Gennady G. Ryabkov, and a keynote speech by Chief Director of Korea Maritime Institute Hwang Jin-hoi. The forum was divided into two sessions which were themed, 'Strategy for the Improvement of Cruise Tourism Industry of Northeast Asia' and 'Method for Connection between Cities for the Activation of Northeast Asian Cruise Tourism.'



Korean East Sea Rim were discussed.

Session 1: Strategy for the Improvement of the Cruise Tourism Industry of Northeast Asia

In the first session, Research Director of International Cruise Industry, Kim Jong-nam, chaired the session and the discussions covered the topics, 'Method of Approach for Effective Port Sales and Marketing Cases of a Port of Call' by Gojima Hiroshi, Chief of International Exchange Division of Port Promotion at Maizuru in Japan, and 'Kamchatka, the Center of Cruise Tourism of Costal Zone in the Northwestern Pacific Ocean and the Eastern Arctic Area' by Svetachev Alexsander, Planning Director of Programming of Diligangs-Kanchatka. Co., and 'Suggestion for the Current Situation and Cooperative Methods of Shanghai Wusongkou International Cruise Terminal in China' by Peng Zhao yun, Assistant of General Accounting Department in Shanghai Wusongkou International Cruise Terminal. There were a total of six debaters including Deputy Director in charge of cruises in Jeju Special Self-Governing Province, Gang Gyeong-taek, Director of Pan Star Cruise, Yoo Da-jong, Secretary General of the Association of Cruise Medical Tourism in Busan, Choi Jae-hyung, Manager of Japanese · Korean Office of Silversea, Itogawa Yusuke, Manager of Japanese · Korean office of Costa Cruise. Co., Hamaoka Souich, and Director of Bureau on Sport · Tourism · Youth Policy of Sakhalin Region, Natalia Pakholkova.

In this session, case studies of the cruise tourism industry like the Port of Maizuru in Japan, the Port of Shanghai Wusongkou in China, the Port of Petropavlovsk-Kamchatsky in Russia, and the Port of Busan in Korea were introduced and policy proposals for the development of the Pohang cruise industry were discussed.

Session 2: Methods for Connection between Cities for the Activation of Northeast Asian Cruise Tourism

In the second session, Kim Jun-hong, Chairman of Gyeongbuk Policy Institute, chaired the session and the discussions covered the topics, 'Current Situation of Pohang and Suggestions for Common Cooperative Methods' by Lee Hee-yong, Professor at Yeongnam University, 'Present State of Maizuru of Kyoto Prefecture in Japan and Suggestions for Collaborative Plan' by Mishima Osamu, Director of Port in Kyoto Prefecture, 'Expansion of the Northeast Asian Cruise Market' by Kvint Kristina, Head Consultant of Tourist Development Division of Tourism Bureau in Sakhalin Region, 'Infrastructure for Cruise Tourism in Pacific Russia, Product Development and Promotion on New Cruises Along the East Sea and the Adjacent Sea' by Nagornyi Valerii, CEO of Vladivostok Sea Cruise Terminal.

Director of Gangwon-do Maritime Tourism Center Lee Byung-seong, Deputy Department Head of Lotte Tourism Jang Woo-seok, Head of the Association of Jeju Cruise Industry Im Young-chul, and Prof. of Pohang University Gang Myung-soo attended it as debaters.

In this session, short, medium, and long-term cruise tourism development plans of Pohang, Maizuru, Vladivostok, Gangwon-do Province were discussed.

3. Additional Event

Before and after the topic presentations and discussions, participants visited Gyeongsangbuk-do Province, Pohang, Gyeongju, and Yeongil Bay there they had a meeting with ship companies, travel agencies, and toured cruise attractions of Pohang and Gyeongju areas. This provided an opportunity for practical exchange and cooperation related to cruise tourism.

2. 2019 Holding Subcommittees

The 17th Subcommittee Meeting on Disaster Prevention

1) Overview

The 17th NEAR meeting of the Subcommittee on Disaster Prevention was held from March 5 to 7, 2019 at Kobe and Miki in Hyogo Prefecture, Japan. The Subcommittee on Disaster Prevention is a representative NEAR Subcommittee and it meets annually to reduce the impact of disasters in Northeast Asian regions through strengthening the capacities of the persons in charge of disaster prevention among member regional governments. The meeting was attended by 30 representatives from 16 member regional governments in four Northeast Asian countries. Delegations from the NEAR Secretariat, including Kim Young-hee, Director of the Department of Planning and Public Relations, also participated and offered their encouragement.

2) Main Content

Persons in charge of disaster prevention presented on recovery process, efforts in various sectors, and action and future support of remaining tasks as well as an overview of the Hansin-Awazi Earthquake which covered the subject of 'Hyogo Prefecture's Information System on Measure for Disaster Prevention.'

In addition, there were questions and answers and exchanges of opinions on disaster prevention measures with case presentations from China, South Korea, Mongolia, and Russia.

3) Additional Events

Participants viewed a video about the site and recovery scene of the Great Hanshin earthquake and the Great Sendai Earthquake and visiting the 'Future Center of Human and Disaster Prevention.' In addition, attendees listened to lectures on lessons for disaster prevention from the Great Hansin earthquake and experienced a real-time disaster situation at Hyogo Wide Anti-Disaster Center. They also toured a stock storage. Furthermore, the participants toured the Nojima Fault Preservation Museum, which preserved and exhibits the Nojima Fault which became exposed on the surface after an earthquake.



The 18th NEAR Subcommittee on Educational · Cultural Exchange

1) Overview

The NEAR Subcommittee on Educational · Cultural Exchange was held at Matsue in Shimane Prefecture, Japan. The meeting was attended by 24 participants from four Northeast Asian countries: China, Japan, South Korea, and Russia. Secretary General Kim Ok-chae also participated in the opening ceremony and offered a message of encouragement. This subcommittee aims to build a new network of mutual understanding and friendship across the countries.

2) Main Content

Participants toured facilities related to forest conservation for six days. They experienced a nature trail at Furusato Forest Park and fulfilled missions such as cooking rice using bamboo. They exchanged their views and experiences during the missions.

3) Additional Events

Attendees of the meeting participated in cultural exchange activities such as local homestays, welcome exchange meeting, and traditional culture experience.



The 1st Subcommittee on Sports

1) Overview

The 1st subcommittee meeting on Sports was held in the Sakha Republic (Yakutia), Russia on August 6, 2019. This subcommittee on Sports was held at the Sakha Convention Hall situated in Yakutsk city. The meeting was attended by 31 attendees from 8 member regional governments from 4 countries including China (4), South Korea (1), Japan (1), and Russia (2).

2) Main Content

This meeting was hosted by the First Deputy Minister of Sports of the Sakha Republic, Cherdonov Semen and NEAR Secretary General Kim Ok-chae. The Republic of Sakha (Yakutia) acted as coordinator and suggested tours of traditional sporting events by regional members. At the following presentations from regional governments, Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region mentioned the dissemination and development of traditional sports of ethnic minorities and the importance of international sports exchange business, and Toyama Prefecture mentioned the importance of international cooperation through sports and case introduction on high school student oriented international sports in Toyama Prefecture.

3) Additional Event

Before holding the meeting, the Sakha Republic (Yakutia) introduced traditional sports such as Mas Wrestling and Hapsagai, and attendees of the meeting experienced traditional games of the Sakha Republic (Yakutia).



The 13th Subcommittee on Economy & Trade

1) Overview

The Subcommittee on Economy & Trade was held in Andong, Gyeongsangbuk-do Province, South Korea from August 22 to 24. 58 participants of 19 NEAR member regional governments from China, Japan, South Korea, Mongolia, and Russia attended the meeting. In particular, Governor of Gyeongsangbuk-do Province Lee Cheolwoo delivered the opening remarks and participated in the opening ceremony, and Secretary General Kim Okchae also gave a guest speech.

2) Main Content

There were special lectures and plenary and keynote lectures given by experts. The theme of the meeting covered the regionalism of Northeast Asia and cross-border cooperation, following case presentations from participants of regional governments by country.

3) Additional Event

After the meeting, the participants attended a cultural performance by the Gyeongsangbuk-do Provincial Dance Company and banquet. The next day, the participants toured the major attractions of Gyeongsangbuk-do Province, and they had the opportunity to deepen their understanding of Korean culture through experiencing traditional culture.



The 14th NEAR Subcommittee on Environment

1) Overview

The 14th Subcommittee on Environment was held at Toyama City in Toyama Prefecture on November 14. The biennial subcommittee meeting was attended by participants from China, Japan, and Russia. Connections between regional governments were made, individual projects were reviewed, performance reports were given, and mutual information was exchanged to carry out environmental preservation measures for Northeast Asian regions. Also, Secretary General Kim Ok-chae and delegations from the NEAR Secretariat attended the meeting, and Secretary General Kim gave a message of encouragement.

2) Main Content

9 participants from 5 regional governments from China, Japan, and Russia attended the meeting and gave presentations on the implementation results of individual projects were also conducted. In addition, opinions were exchanged and consultations between NEAR members took place regarding individual project proposals and future environmental subcommittee activities plans. Furthermore, there were presentations on advanced environmental measures and active information sharing by Liaoning Province and Primorsky Territory.

3) Additional Event

On the next day of the meeting, the participants attended the 'Northeast Asia Area Drift Measures Staff Meeting' and inspected related facilities later.



The 6th Subcommittee on Maritime Affairs and Fisheries

1) Overview

The 6th forum of the NEAR Subcommittee on Maritime Affairs and Fisheries was held at Weihai, Shandong Province from December 4 to 6. It was attended by approximately 400 participants from three NEAR regional members, consul generals, press, scholars, public officers, and company representatives. The Subcommittee on Maritime Affairs and Fisheries is held every two years to promote cooperation and exchange in the maritime fishery field of Northeast Asia.

2) Main Content

The welcoming speech was given by Weihai Mayor and Deputy Secretary, Zhang Haibo, and congratulatory address was given by NEAR Secretary General, Kim Ok-chae, who announced the opening of the meeting. Keynote speeches were given by experts such as Deputy Head of Trade Faculty of Shandong University, Yang Lin, Researcher of Northeast Asian Studies, and Kim Yong-hwan, Chief Researcher of Marine Industry Research Institute for East Sea Rim in South Korea. In particular, Shandong Province announced the installment of the secretariat of the Subcommittee on Maritime Affairs and Fisheries and a trade center of fishery products at Weihai. A signboard hanging ceremony was held and attended by NEAR Secretary General Kim Ok-chae, Vice Governor of Shandong Province Yu Guo-an, and Mayor Zhang Hai-bo.

Next, topic presentations followed. They were divided into two sessions titled, 'Marine Life and Health Food Industry in Transition and Upgrade,' and 'The Role of Smart Technology for Offshore High-End Equipment Development'.

3) Additional Event

Participants inspected related facilities and enterprises such as Yandunjiao, Shandong Lanrun Weilangu Marine Technology Co., Ltd., and Shawo Island National Ocean Fishery Base.

IV. Working-level Workshop 2019

1. Overview

The NEAR Working-level Workshop 2019 was held at Hyundai Hotel in Gyeongju, Gyeongsangbuk-do Province, South Korea from April 24 to 26 for three days. This workshop was attended by approximately 100 working-level staff from 39 NEAR regional governments from 7 Chinese regional governments, 4 Japanese regional governments, 11 South Korean regional governments, 14 Mongolian regional governments, and 3 Russian regional governments. (* 19 attendees from China, 12 attendees from Japan, 18 attendees from South-Korea, 27 attendees from Mongolia, and 4 attendees from Russia)

The Working-level Workshop is a place for working-level officials of NEAR regional governments to gather to exchange opinions on NEAR activities and to form a human network between regional governments. This year is the fourteenth workshop, with a total of 1,100 participants.

This workshop started with major business reports from the NEAR Secretariat, introductions on main events from regional governments and was followed by discussions on NEAR issues. Later, there were active discussions by working-level staff from regional governments and various opinions were gathered with regard to the operation of the membership fee and its usage, a major issue of the Association.



2. Major Activities

Report on the main business of the Secretariat

The NEAR Secretariat reported on 2018 business results and major work plans for 2019. The Secretariat introduced the 12th NEAR General Assembly and various subcommittee activities such as major achievements in 2018 and the 12th NEAR Working Committee and subcommittee holding schedules as major promotion tasks in 2019. Also, the 2019 NEAR International Forum, Northeast Asia Young Leaders Forum, and the 7th Youth Art Contest plan were announced and the Secretariat asked for active cooperation and participation.



Presentations from Regional Governments

Heilongjiang Province in China requested the active participation and cooperation of the regional governments as a promotion on a holding schedule of the Subcommittee on Logistics and Transportation, the Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region promoted the regional government concerned, and Shandong Province promoted the holding of Subcommittee on Maritime Affairs and Fisheries.

Toyama Prefecture in Japan reported on the activities and presented their holding plans of the Subcommittee on Environment, Hyogo Prefecture reported on the activities of Subcommittee on Disaster Prevention and next holding plans, and Shimane Prefecture reported on the activities of Subcommittee on Educational · Cultural Exchange. Daegu Metropolitan City in South Korea promoted specialized local cultural tourism resources.

Bayankhongor Province and Khentii Province in Mongolia attracted the interest of other participating regional governments through the promotion of regional government concerned, and the Republic of Sakha(Yakutia) in Russia asked for active participation from other regional governments, promoting holding of Working Committee 2019 and Subcommittee on Sports, and Krasnoyarsk Region promoted BIRYUSA Youth Forum and NEAR Northeast Asia Young Leaders Forum respectively.



Discussion on Main Agenda

This Working-level Workshop provided meaningful time to gather opinions from working staff of each regional governments regarding the 'membership fee system' which is a major issue, 'activation methods of new subcommittees,' and 'suggestions on opinions on the desirable management method and purpose and use of the membership fee.'

<Desirable management method and purpose and use of the membership fee>

According to the payment period of the initial annual fee which was decided in the 12th Working Committee in 2019, the desirable management method and purpose and use of the membership fee was discussed, and various opinions from the working staffs of each regional government were discussed. Therefore, the Secretariat was required to conduct further review, and in case the Secretariat needs to carry out an opinion survey of each member, it would be conducted at a later date.



<Activation methods of new subcommittees>

As discussions are needed on concrete and practical methods for the management and activation of new subcommittees, regional governments formed a consensus on the opinion by the Secretariat that coordinator regional governments shall report project plans for the term to the General Assembly or to the Working Committee.

3. Additional Event

A night tour of sites including Donggung Palace, Wolji Pond, and Cheomseongdae of Gyeongju, a host place was conducted on April 24. On April 25, participants experienced the life of a classical scholar at Seoak Seowon and they were introduced to the culture of Korean classical scholars.

Also, participants had a rare opportunity to experience the cultural and tourist resources of beautiful Gyeongju firsthand, and they visited the East Palace Garden and Bird Park on the last day, April 26.

By introducing unique Korean traditional cultural resources and helping the Chinese, Japanese, Mongolian, and Russian participants to experience Korean culture, the workshop endeavored to help the participants to understand the different cultures of each country.

V. Northeast Asia Young Leaders Forum 2019 / The 7th NEAR Youth Art Contest

1. Northeast Asia Young Leaders Forum 2019

1. Overview

The Northeast Asia Young Leaders Forum 2019 was held at a BIRYUSA camp site in Krasnoyarsk Region, located in central Siberia from July 9 to 15. It was themed, 'Historical Exchange and the Future of Northeast Asia.'

^rNortheast Asia Young Leaders Forum 2019_J, which was co-hosted by the NEAR Secretariat and Krasnoyarsk Region, was held to instill a global mindset in the youth of the region who would be in charge of the future of Northeast Asia and help them grow into responsible leaders through mutual cooperation.

This forum, which was organized by the NEAR Secretariat, celebrated its fourth run and was held in Russia for the first time at the request of Krasnoyarsk Territory, which has been running camps focusing on youth policy since 2006, and it consisted of lectures, discussions, presentations, and a culture night event.

Kim Ok-chae, Secretary General of NEAR and Aleksandr Uss, Governor of Krasnoyarsk Region participated in the opening ceremony and gave a celebratory message. Secretary General Kim called all those present to be main players of Northeast Asia in the 21st century, the era of peace, through the cultivation of tolerance based on an understanding of cultural diversity and mutual respect.



2. Main Activity

Approximately 60 participants of 21 NEAR Regional Governments from five countries, China, Japan, Mongolia, Russia, and South Korea, attended the forum. The forum consisted of lectures on different subjects, group discussions, and presentations. Beginning with a lecture provided by the Director of the Bureau of Foreign Relations, Olga Korosteleva, participants listened to lectures given by professionals in various fields like 'Sustainable Development and Regional Development Strategy in Northeast Asia,' 'Trade and Economic Development Cooperation in Northeast Asia,' 'Sustainable Global Management Strategy in Northeast Asia,' and 'Sustainable Economic Development and Entrepreneurship in Northeast Asia.' Afterwards, participants divided into five teams and took part in discussions and presentations according to the topics and assignments.



3. Cultural Exchange

The participants had time to understand mutual cultures by interacting with more than 600 local participants who attended the ^rAll Russian Forum_J of BIRYUSA. Vladimir Putin, the President of the Russian Federation, encouraged attendees to enjoy the forum giving a celebratory message through an autograph letter. Participants socialized through sports activities such as archery, trampoline, volleyball, etc. and enjoyed 'Culture Night,' participating in events like 'Mr. & Miss BIRYUSA Contest.' Furthermore, they exchanged and understood other's cultures through a talent show which was prepared by each participant.



2. The 7th NEAR Youth Art Contest

The NEAR Secretariat is holding an art contest to promote cultural exchange among the youth in Northeast Asia through works of art such as paintings.

This year, 170 art works were submitted by five countries: 47 from China, 4 from Japan, 4 from South Korea, 19 from Mongolia, and 96 from Russia. The works focused on promoting NEAR and introducing the cultures of NEAR regional members.

As a result, 'Exploration of Pteridophyte', a watercolor by Kirillova Ekaterina, a student of Tomsk Children's Art School No.2 of Tomsk Region in Russia, was awarded the Grand Award. Students from Ningxia Hui Autonomous Region of China, Uvs Province and Selenge Province of Mongolia, and Krasnoyarsk Region of Russia were awarded the excellence award.

The NEAR Youth Art Contest, which was celebrated its seventh run, was a meaningful event due to more active participation from the regional members than in previous years. Prize-winning works were introduced on the NEAR homepage and are expected to be exhibited from early 2020 at cultural centers in Andong and Pohang City, South Korea.



Inauguration of the 5th Secretary General of the Association of North East Asia Regional Governments (NEAR), Kim Ok-chae



Wrestling was introduced at the meeting and the Sakha Republic expressed hopes that each NEAR Member would discuss developmental strategies in a bid to foster and propagate traditional sports. Meanwhile, the NEAR Secretariat decided to carry forward traditional sporting events suggested by the Republic of Sakha on the assumption that interested member regional governments would participate and present documents in advance to all NEAR members.



The 12th Working Committee Meeting Held at Yakutsk, the Republic of Sakha (Yakutia) from Tuesday, August 6 to Thursday, August 8

The 12th Working Committee Meeting was held at Yakutsk City, the Republic of Sakha on Wednesday, August 7. There were 79 attendees from the NEAR Secretariat and 19 Member Regional Governments from four countries. At this meeting, international exchange events of member governments were introduced and follow-up discussions were held on plans to improve the operations of NEAR events, postponement on membership fee of members, and plans for the appointment of honorary ambassadors by each regional member. In conclusion, the original agenda set by the Secretariat was passed in favor of the majority including 30 regional governments which exercised their voting rights in writing. Furthermore, the NEAR Secretariat presented the total operating expenditure provided by the Gyeongsangbuk-do Province of the Republic of Korea in support of the permanent Secretariat since 2005 and detailed budget contents of the Secretariat responded to the first time. Lastly, although there were partial improvements in the relay interpretation since the Secretariat responded to feedback by providing details to interpreters in advance, the Secretariat has become aware of the meetings.

1. Establishment of the Secretariat

In 2004, a permanent office of four-year term was adopted at the 5th General Assembly of Heilongjiang Province, China. Accordingly, the operation of a permanent secretariat was decided at the General Assembly, Gyeongsangbuk-do Province, South Korea proposed to attract a permanent secretariat on the condition that the entire cost would be covered by the Gyeongsangbuk-do Province. Later, at the 9th General Assembly held by Ningxia Hui Autonomous Region, China in 2012, it was decided that the permanent secretariat would be located in Gyeongsangbuk-do Province, South Korea to ensure the consistent operation of the Secretariat.



2. Secretariat Organization and Personnel

The Secretariat is managed by the Secretary General and the two-part system (Department of Planning and Public Relations, Department of International Cooperation), and it is jointly staffed by public officials dispatched from Chinese, Japanese, South Korean, Mongolian, and Russian regional governments and experts.

3. Budget

The operating cost of the Secretariat is around KRW 1.5 billion (USD 1.28 million / CNY 8.94 million / JPY 140 million) and is covered by Gyeongsangbuk-do Province (70%) and Pohang (30%) of South Korea.

4. Task

- A. Coordination of working contacts between regional governments
- B. Supporting operation and execution of decisions of General Assembly, Working Committee, and Subcommittee
- C. Conducting projects of the Secretariat such as NEAR International Forum, Working–level Workshop, and Northeast Asia Young Leaders Forum, etc.
- D. Development and investment of exchange programs for the development of the Association
- E. Establishing networks between international organizations and regional research institutes
- F. International public relations
- G. Preparation of business plan, annual report, and accounting report
- H. Budgeting and budget execution

Charter of The Association of North East Asia Regional Governments

Preamble

In the spirit of reciprocity and equity, representatives of regional governments in the North East Asian Region, which has unlimited potential to contribute to the international community, have resolved to combine our efforts to accomplish co-development in the region and, at the same time, to contribute to world peace by promoting exchange and cooperation in all fields of administration, economy and culture. Accordingly, to accomplish these noble aims, the representatives have agreed to the present Charter of The Association of North East Asia Regional Governments and do hereby establish an international organization to be known as The Association of North East Asia Regional Governments.

Chapter 1 Name and Purposes of the Association

Article 1 (Name) This organization shall be named as "The Association of North East Asia Regional Governments" (hereinafter referred to as "The Association").

Article 2 (Purposes) In the spirit of reciprocity and equity, "The Association" has the purposes of pursuing joint development of the North East Asian Region and, at the same time, contributing to world peace by building trust on mutual understanding through the establishment of networks for exchanges and cooperation among member governments.

Article 3 (Agenda) "The Association" shall perform the following clause:

- 1. Regularly hold the Conference of North East Asian Regional Governments(The General Assembly)
- 2. Collect and distribute information on economic and technological development within the region
- 3. Support and execute projects related to exchange and cooperation
- 4. Review projects pertinent to accomplish the purposes of the Association

Chapter 2 Scope and Rights & Obligations of Members and Others

Article 4 (Membership scope) The members of the Association shall be the regional governments of People's Republic of China, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Japan, Mongolia, Republic of Korea, and Russian Federation, which agreed to the purposes of the Association. The membership is open to other regional governments, and will be effected by a decision of the General Assembly. (revised on September 27, 2016)

Article 4-2 (Associate Membership scope) The associate members of the Association shall be the regional governments of countries located in Asia excluding the North East region, which have agreed to the purposes of the Association and obtained the approval of membership by the General Assembly. (newly enacted on September 27, 2016)

Article 5 (Rights and Obligations of Members) Members shall have the rights to participate in various projects and activities performed by the Association, and have the obligations to comply with the provisions stipulated in the Charter.

Article 5-2 (Rights and Obligations of Associate Members) Associate Members do not have the right to vote and are not eligible to run for election as addressed in Article 7 and Article 9 Clause 1 of Rights and Obligations of Members. (newly enacted on September 27, 2016)

Chapter 3 Organization and Functions

Section 1 The General Assembly

Article 6 (Structure and Operation) The General Assembly is the supreme legislative body of the Association, which consists of heads of member organizations, and is held biennially. (revised on September 27, 2016)

Article 7 (Executives) The General Assembly shall be given due authority to appoint executives to positions specified below.

- 1. The General Assembly shall designate one person as the chair who represents the Association. The head of the regional government, which holds the General Assembly, shall ex officio become the chair of the General Assembly. The chair's term of office ends on the last day of the General Assembly. However, when the chair cannot represent the Association, the deputy representative of the regional government shall act as the chair on behalf of the representative. (revised on 28 October, 2010)
- 2. Each country shall have an auditor. Auditors shall administer accounting and audit, and be elected at the General Assembly. The auditor's term of office is the same as stipulated in clause 1 of Article 7. (revised on September 27, 2016)
- 3. On the decision based on the regulations of membership fee, the right to vote and be elected stated in clause 1 for chair and clause 2 for auditor can be restricted. (newly enacted on September 27, 2016)

Article 8 (Functions) General Assembly shall perform the following clause.

- 1. Resolution of member and associate member admission and dismissal (revised on September 27, 2016)
- 2. Determination of membership fees
- 3. Amendment of the Association Charter
- 4. Determination of termination and liquidation of the Association
- 5. Determination of the venue for the Secretariat
- 6. Appointment of auditors
- 7. Approval of budget, project plans, settlement of accounts
- 8. Approval of the regulations of the Membership System (newly enacted on September 27, 2016)
- 9. Determination of agendas related to the next General Assembly
- 10. Determination and execution of business plans of the Association
- 11. Other functions deemed to be necessary

Article 9 (Resolution) Decision-making of the General Assembly shall be made as the following clause:

- Each regional government member shall have one vote. However, the right to vote may be restricted in certain situations as determined by the rules of the Membership Fee System. (revised on September 27, 2016)
- 2. The particular specified under clauses 1 to 5 of Article 8 shall be resolved by more than half of the members present and a two-thirds majority of the members voting. (revised on September 27, 2016)
- 3. The particular specified under clause 6 to 11 of Article 8, shall be resolved by more than half of the members present and more than half of the members voting. (revised on September 27, 2016)

Article 9-2 (Decision-making Delegated to Working Committee)

1. In years that the General Assembly is not held, the decision-making items listed in Article 8 Clauses 1, 7, and 8 can be commissioned to the Working Committee. (newly enacted on September 27, 2016)

Section 2 Working Committee

Article 10 (Organization and Operation)

- The Working Committee consists of director-general level senior administrative staff nominated by the head of each member regional government. However, if deemed necessary by the executive of Working Committee, a meeting of the interim working committee may convene. (newly enacted on October 22, 2014) (revised on October 29, 2018)
- 2. The chair of the Working Committee shall be the vice head of the chair local government.
- 3. The chair of the Working Committee reports the result of the meeting to the General Assembly.
- 4. For smooth operation of individual projects and other works, a separate subcommittee or subcommittees for each field of work may be organized as a supporting organization for the Working Committee. However, the newly established subcommittees shall be reported to the General Assembly. (newly enacted on October 21, 1998) (revised on October 29, 2018)

Article 11 (Functions) The Working Committee shall perform the following clause.

- 1. Discussion of business plans and individual projects
- 2. Documentation of annual reports and audit reports
- 3. Coordination of opinions among members
- 4. Determination of the establishment of sub-committees(composition, functions and operations) (newly enacted on September, 1998)
- 5. Determination of issues delegated by the General Assembly to the Working Committee
- 6. Other functions deemed to be necessary

Section 3 The Secretariat

Article 12 (Organization and Operation) The Secretariat is a standing body of "the Association." Each member government may set up a liaison body if necessary. The Secretariat will remain in Gyeongsangbuk-do Province. In case of unavoidable reasons, however, the location of the Secretariat may change after the resolution of the General Assembly. (revised on October 22, 2014)

Article 13 (Executives and staffs) The Secretariat shall have the following executives and staffs:

- 1. The Secretary-General shall be one person. The Secretary-General shall be recommended by the head of the member regional government where the Secretariat is located and be appointed by the Chair of the Association.
- 2. The executives and staffs of the Secretariat shall be comprised of government officials dispatched by "the Association" in principle. However, when it is deemed necessary by the Secretary General, it can be constituted in a separate way after receiving approval from the chair of the Association.

Article 14 (Functions) The Secretariat shall perform the following clause.

- 1. Budgeting and budget execution
- 2. Documentations of business plans, annual reports, and accounting reports
- 3. Liaisons and coordination among members
- 4. Execution of decisions made by the General Assembly and the Working Committee
- 5. Other functions deemed to be necessary

Article 15 (Finance)

- 1. The accounting of the Secretariat shall be treated as special accounting, and its operations shall be covered by membership fees and other miscellaneous income.
- 2. Accounting shall temporarily be carried out in accordance with the following clauses:
 - 1) The members of the Association shall pay the membership fee and the matters necessary for the management and the operation of the membership fee shall be prescribed in the separate regulations on the membership fee system. (revised on September 27, 2016)
 - 2) All expenses incurred by holding the General Assembly and the Working Committee shall be covered and shared as follows:
 - A. Half (B) of the total expenses (A) shall be borne by the regional government hosting the conference.
 - B. As to the other half (C=A-B), the rest of the regional governments shall share the amount (C/D), which is equally divided by the number of the regional governments of the Association, excluding the host of the conference (D).
 - C. In the event that the number of regional governments actually participating in the conference is less than D, the balance shall be borne by the regional government hosting the conference.
 - D. In the event that a member regional government is unable to bear a significant portion of the expense due to unavoidable circumstances such as natural disasters, the expense to be borne may be partially reduced to a reasonable level based on the agreement of other member regional governments.
 - E. During the General Assembly, the regional government which proposed to host the next General Assembly shall submit tentative accounting of expenses for organizing the General Assembly and the Working Committee.
- 3. The operating expenses of the Secretariat shall be borne by the member government which hosts the Secretariat.
- 4. Expenses for other individual cooperation projects shall be covered by the member government which proposed those projects. However, based on agreement, they may be shared among participating members which desire to join the projects.

Section 4 Associated Supporting Organizations

Article 16 (Establishment) Aimed at contributing to the development of the North East Asian region, each member regional government may establish a supporting organization (hereinafter referred to as 'Supporting Organization of the Association') to support the activities of the Association (newly enacted on September 1998).

Article 17 (Registration)

- 1. In the event that a member regional government establishes a Supporting Organization of the Association, it can register the organization by submitting application (newly enacted on September 1998).
- The Supporting Organization of the Association shall report its activities to the Association (newly enacted on September 1998).

Chapter 4 Final Provisions

Article 18 (Effectuation) This Charter shall take effect from the 27th of September 2016. (revised on September 27, 2016)

Article 19 (The Scope of Members) The founding members of the Association consist of regional governments, which attended the conference of the Association of North East Asia Regional Governments in 1996 and agreed to the basic spirit of the Charter.

Article 20 (Language) This Charter shall be written in English and in the languages of the countries where the member regions belong. Original copies of which shall be kept at the archive of the Secretariat and copies of which shall be kept by each member. (revised on October 28, 2010)

In faith whereof, the representatives of the regional governments, who were given the due authority from each member government, have signed the present Charter of The Association of North East Asia Regional Governments in Gyeongju City, Gyeongsangbuk-do Province, Republic of Korea on the 12th day of September, 1996.

Regulations for the Establishment and Operation of Subcommittees of The Association of North East Asia Regional Governments

The present regulations stipulate rules regarding the establishment and operation of subcommittees in accordance with Clause 4 of Article 10 of the Charter of NEAR. <revised on September 26, 2017>

Article 1 (Establishment) For smooth operation of individual projects or tasks (hereinafter referred to as "Individual Projects") proposed at conferences of the Association of North East Asia Regional Governments, subcommittees shall be established for each field of work. <revised on September 26, 2017>

Article 2 (Name and Working Area) The names of the subcommittees shall be as follows :

- 1. Subcommittee on Economy & Humanities <revised on September 11, 2013>
- 2. Subcommittee on Environment
- 3. Subcommittee on Educational and Cultural Exchange <integrated on September 2, 2008>
- 4. Subcommittee on Disaster Prevention
- 5. Deleted <on September 26, 2017>
- 6. Deleted <on September 26, 2017>
- 7. Subcommittee on Oceans and Fishery <September 2, 2008>
- 8. Subcommittee on Tourism <September 2, 2008>
- Subcommittee on Mineral Resources Development and Coordination <newly enacted on October 28, 2010, revised September 26, 2017>
- 10. Subcommittee on Energy and Climate Change <October 28, 2010>
- 11. Deleted <on September 26, 2017>
- 12. Subcommittee on Life & Medical Industry <July 19, 2011>
- 13. Subcommittee on Agriculture <July 19, 2011>
- 14. Subcommittee on Sports <September 11, 2013>
- 15. Subcommittee on Logistics and Transportation <September 26, 2017>
- 16. Subcommittee on International Exchange of Human Resources <September 26, 2017>
- 17. Subcommittee on E-Commerce <September 26, 2017>
- 18. Subcommittee on Innovation Plus <October 29, 2018>
- 19. Subcommittee on Youth Policy <October 29, 2018>
- 20. Subcommittee on Traditional Medicines <October 29, 2018>

Article 3 (Functions)

1. Each subcommittee reviews and discusses methods to materialize and realize project plans by coordinating opinions among regional governments in order to promote effective execution of "Individual Projects" led by member regional governments. <revised on September 26, 2017>

2. Each subcommittee shall report the results of the review and discussion on "Individual Projects" proposed by regional governments to the Working Committee. <revised on September 26, 2017>

Article 4 (Structure) Each subcommittee consists of directors of local government divisions who have interest in the field that each subcommittee is responsible for.

Article 5 (Operation)

- 1. An elected member regional government (hereinafter referred to as "Coordinator") shall be in charge of liaison, coordination and operation of each subcommittee. <revised on September 26, 2017>
- 2. The office term of a "Coordinator" is two years, and it can be reelected. Upon request, a subcommittee can be co-operated with co-hosting coordinator. <revised on July 19, 2011, September 26, 2017>
- 3. In principal, the operation of a subcommittee shall be based on telecommunications such as postal mail, fax, and e-mail.
- Each subcommittee should convene once a year for a meeting or NEAR-related activity during its term as coordinator. <revised on July 19, 2011, September 26, 2017>
- The coordinator should endeavor to allow as many participants from NEAR member regional governments to participate in the subcommittee meeting. <newly enacted on July 19, 2011, revised September 26, 2017>
- If necessary, Working Committee can conduct evaluations on subcommittee's operation. <newly enacted on July 19, 2011>
- 7. The NEAR Secretariat may propose a replacement of subcommittee coordinators to the Working Committee if the subcommittee has not run meetings more than two years and another regional government wishes to take over the role of coordinator. <newly enacted on October 29, 2018>
- 8. The replacement of the coordinator of subcommittees will be decided at the Working Committee where the majority of the members are present and the members with the right to vote cast a majority (more than half) yes vote. <newly enacted on October 29, 2018>

Article 6 (Participation)

- 1. All member regions are eligible to participate in a subcommittee. <revised on July 19, 2011>
- For efficient operation and practical outcomes of each subcommittee, the coordinator may invite specialists, experts or business persons from NEAR member regional governments. <newly enacted on September 26, 2017>

Article 7 (Expenses) Expenses for the operation of each subcommittee shall be borne by the "Coordinator." In the event of a Sub- Committee meeting being convened, expenses for transportation and accommodation shall be covered by participating regional governments, in principle.

Article 8 (Relation to the Secretariat) Each "Coordinator" shall send updated information of the subcommittee to the Secretariat, which shall distribute the documentation to the rest of the regional governments. <revised on July 19, 2011, revised on September 26, 2017>

Article 9 (Revision of Regulations) Revision of the present regulations shall be decided by the Working Committee.

Article 10 (Effectuation) These regulations shall take effect and be in full force on 11 September, 2013 < revised on September 11, 2013>

Supplementary Provision

These regulations shall take effect and be in full force on October 21, 1998.

Supplementary Provision

These regulations shall take effect and be in full force on September 4, 2007.

Supplementary Provision

These regulations shall take effect and be in full force on September 2, 2008.

Regulations for the Membership Fee System

(Enforcement) August 7, 2019

(Establishment) September 28, 2016

(Partial Revision) September 26, 2017

(Partial Revision) August 7, 2019

Article 1 (Purpose)

This regulation seeks to prescribe matters related to the management and operation of the membership fee and its usage.

Article 2 (Principles of Accounting)

Accounting shall be conducted by the principles below.

- 1. The Secretary General shall maintain transparency and reliability of the accounting process by submitting objective and evidential documents.
- 2. The Secretary General shall disclose information on the operation of the membership fee when requested by members and shall manage it effectively.
- 3. The Secretary-General shall manage the membership fee effectively.

Article 3 (Fiscal Year)

The fiscal year of the Association shall be from January 1 to December 31 of each year.

Article 4 (Responsibilities in Accounting)

The Secretary General shall be responsible for the management of the membership fee, and for any related processes.

Article 5 (Membership Fees)

The membership fee shall be applied in accordance to the following clauses:

- 1. Each member shall pay an annual fee of USD 1,000.
- 2. The currency that shall be used is United States Dollars (USD), and the fee shall be paid by April 30 of each fiscal year. NEAR members who are new to the Association shall pay the fee starting in the year following the approval of its membership.
- 3. Membership fees may be adjusted at the General Assembly depending on economic status.

Article 6 (Regulation of Member Rights)

When a member fails to pay the membership fee, the rights of members may be restricted by the Secretariat.

- 1. Each regional government which has paid the membership fee shall have the right to vote at the General Assembly and the Working Committee and the right to vote for board members, as well as become eligible to become board members.
- 2. The rights of members listed in the in Article 6 (1) can be restricted when a member fails to pay the membership fee more than twice.

Article 7 (Execution)

The fund shall be used for development and projects of NEAR to meet the common goals of the members. The Secretariat shall gather the opinions of members when selecting projects that require funding.

Article 8 (Installation, Composition, and Operation of the Deliberation Committee)

The Deliberation Committee shall install, compose, and operate in accordance to the following clauses:

- The Deliberation Committee constitutes of one person at a managerial or director level of each member country that dispatched public officers to Secretariat. However, in case of the Republic of Korea, the Committee member will be elected from regions other than Gyeongsangbuk-do Province and exclude regional members, including auditors.
- 2. The term of each committee member shall be within the period of secondment of dispatched officials from each member country.
- 3. The Review Committee shall have a chairperson and he/she will be elected by mutual vote.
- 4. To facilitate the smooth operation of the Deliberation Committee, the committee shall be operated by a suitable person who is in charge of the Secretariat.
- 5. The Chairman of the committee shall hold a meeting more than once a year. However, if there has a difficulty in convening committee members, it can be resolved in writing.
- 6. A meeting of the Deliberation Committee shall be formed by more than half of the members present and resolved by the votes of more than half the members.

Article 9 (Budget Planning for Fee Conduction)

The Secretary General shall draw up and submit a general budget plan for the following year to the board of directors for approval by June 30.

Article 10 (Deliberation and Decision)

- A request for the approval of financial plans submitted by the Secretary General and approved by the Deliberation Committee must be made at least 1 month before the meeting of the General Assembly or Working Committee is held.
- 2. Financial plans shall be approved by the decision of the General Assembly or Working Committee.

Article 11 (Budget and Execution of Project Plans)

- 1. The Secretary-General shall execute budgets and project plans approved at the General Assembly and the Working Committee.
- 2. The Secretary-General may make necessary expenditures after receiving the Chairperson's approval in case of extraordinary disbursements. In such cases, the Secretary-General shall need to report and get approval at the General Assembly and the Working Committee held for the current year.

Article 12 (Examination of Accounts)

- 1. The Secretary General shall prepare and communicate to auditors periodical financial reports by May 31 every fiscal year.
- Auditors shall submit audit reports and comments to the Secretariat a month before the meeting of the General Assembly or Working Committee, and the reports shall be approved at the meeting.

Article 13 (Appointment and Term of Auditors)

The appointment and term of auditors shall be executed in accordance with Article 7(Executives) and Article 8(Functions) of the Charter.

ADDENDUM

These Articles shall enter into force on January 1, 2017. (However, the payment time of membership fee will be delayed for the time being.) <Revised: August 7, 2019>
