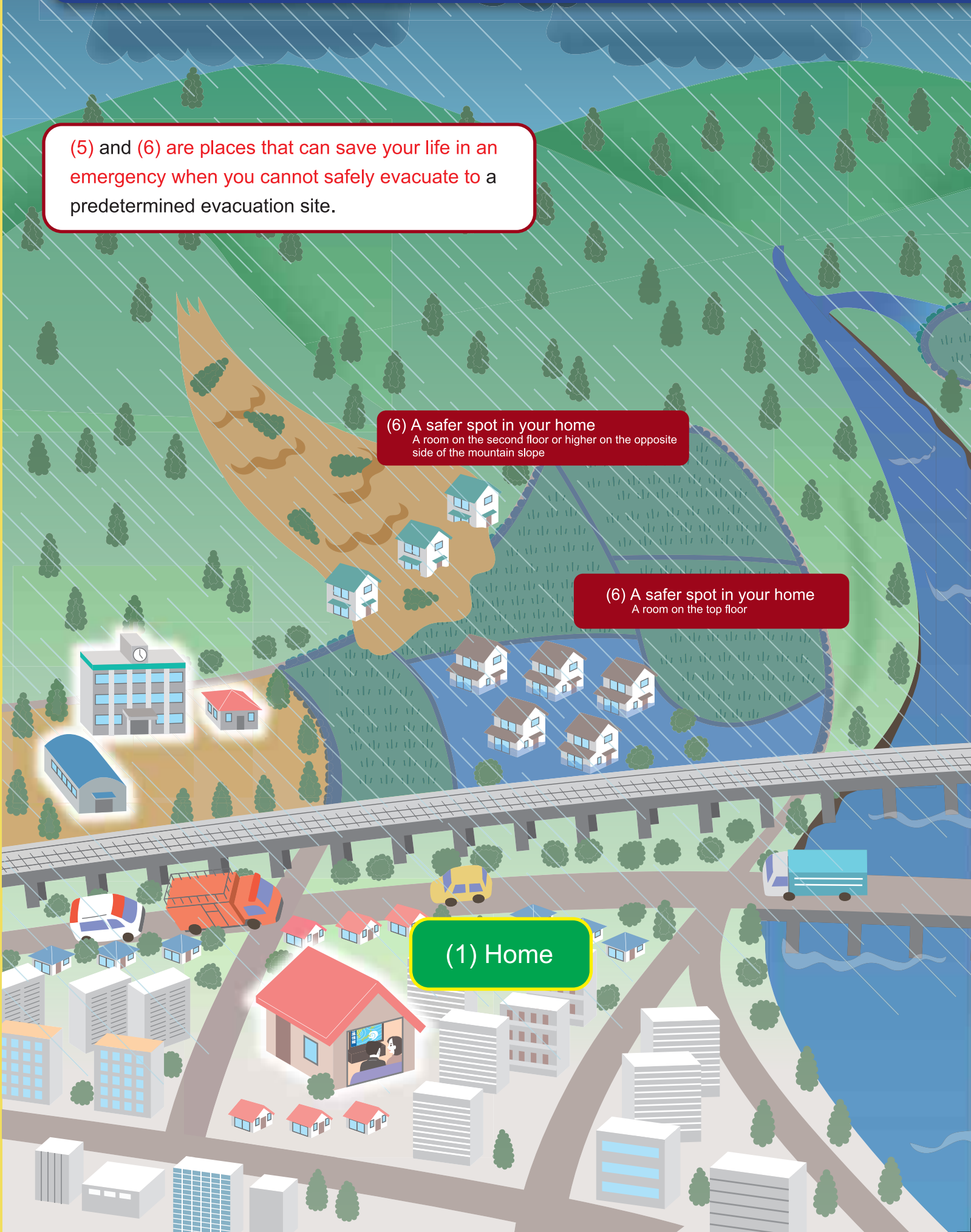
## Protect your own life Guide for Various Ways to Evacuate during Natural Disasters

Prepare yourself for natural disasters and think about where to evacuate now



It is you who can protect your own life by determining whether it is safe to stay at your current location or decide where to evacuate to when a natural disaster is imminent.
